Who Can Enroll?

- Targeted youth are ages 12-17
- Focus on active middle or high school students but will accept drop outs
- May be adjudicated youth
- May be in diversion programs
- May be at risk for delinquency due to: abuse, homelessness, dropping out of school, family violence, substance abuse, gangs, foster care
- Youth with disabilities are a priority population



What Do Volunteer Mentors Do?

- Direct individual and group mentoring services to recruited youth
- Minimum of four hours of mentoring monthly
- One-year minimum mentoring commitment
- Pass extensive background check
- Recruit from underrepresented populations, people familiar with targeted youth, knowledgeable about career exploration, and from multiple community sources

Matching Mentors and Youth:

- Personality matches between mentors and mentees are essential
- Shared interests & hobbies
- Similarity between youth's career interests & the mentor's career
- Availability of meeting times
- Geographic proximity (most useful if matches meet in community)
- Specific skills or abilities
- Personal temperament (Mentors & Mentees)
- Expressed preferences
- Special needs of the youth
- Gender
- Cultural/racial/ethnic background & language
- Religious affiliation
- Chemistry

BUILD ON YOUTH'S
STRENGTHS AND ASSETS

Outcome Goals of the Program

- 50% of youth or their families receive other services offered by the Goodwill or partners.
- 50% of youth participate in service learning activities.
- 85% of program youth in the program for a school year will complete a job readiness or training program.
- 65% of program youth achieve one or more of their desired goals (improved attendance, grades, school behavior, etc.).
- 80% of program youth who complete at least one year in the program will NOT offend or re-offend.

Mentor Pre-Service Requirements

- Written application
- Criminal history check and Child Protective Services Registry check with clearance to work with children
- Personal interview
- Provide three personal references
- Six hours of training and orientation
