# **Goodwill Equals People Working**

Goodwill is one of the world's largest nonprofit providers of education, training, and career services for people with physical, mental and emotional disabilities or disadvantages, such as welfare dependency, homelessness, and lack of education or work experience.

Goodwill believes work has the power to transform lives by building self-confidence, independence, creativity, trust and friendships. Everyone deserves an opportunity to have these benefits.

Goodwill was founded in 1902, in Boston by Rev. Edgar J. Helms, a Methodist minister and early social innovator. Helms collected used household goods and clothing in wealthier areas of the city, then trained and hired those who were poor to mend and repair the used goods. The goods were then resold or were given to the people who repaired them. The system worked, and the Goodwill philosophy of "a hand up, not a hand out" was born.

Licking/Knox Goodwill Industries, Inc. is one of 167 autonomous worldwide members of Goodwill Industries International. Goodwill has provided quality employment and training services to Licking County and central Ohio private businesses, local, state, and federal agencies since 1957.

Today, Licking/Knox Goodwill employs in excess of 400 people. This includes over 40 administrative and management staff who oversee contract work services, seven retail locations and an internet sales location (www.shopgoodwill.com), vocational rehabilitation services, automotive sales, automotive service, and maintenance divisions.

Licking/Knox Goodwill is accredited by CARF, The Rehabilitation Accreditation Commission. This represents the highest level of accreditation achievable in the fields of employment and community support services, behavioral health and medical rehabilitation. Every three years, CARF accredited organizations must pass a rigorous review process that demonstrates that its programs and services are of the highest quality meeting measurable and accountable standards.

Licking/Knox Goodwill prides itself as good stewards of our resources. The finance department is fully computerized, annually audited by public accountants, and complies with GAAP Accounting Standards.

As one of the largest Janitorial Service providers in the state, Licking/Knox Goodwill operates 74 Janitorial Contracts throughout central Ohio. Our trained staff has successfully maintained a vast array of facilities with customer specific needs, including office and warehouse facilities, laboratories, hospitals as well as city and county judicial chambers. Licking/Knox Goodwill's Janitorial Services provide quality, competitively priced work, meeting specific customer standard and specifications. Janitorial, maintenance and labor intensive jobs provide Goodwill clients with gainful employment.

# Vocational Rehabilitation

## What is Vocational Rehabilitation?

Goodwill Vocational Rehabilitation is a series of programs used to assist an individual's transition into the workforce. Real life people needing real life services are what Goodwill is about. The referring agency is billed for services provided and will be kept informed of a client's progress through written reports and evaluations completed by Goodwill's Vocational Rehabilitation Specialists.

## **Enrollment Process**

Clients are typically referred to Licking/Knox Goodwill's Vocational Rehabilitation Department by other social service agencies. However, clients may call Goodwill directly. We will work closely with self-referred clients to establish their eligibility for our services. Any agency or company who agree to our fee schedule may refer clients. Licking/Knox Goodwill Industries, Inc. works with job seekers who are serious about using their skills and/or experience to obtain competitive employment.



# Benefits to Employers

Goodwill continually seeks partnerships with local businesses to provide a variety of work opportunities for our Goodwill clients. Employers receive "free labor" in exchange for providing a client the opportunity to transition back into the workforce. The employer is given the opportunity to evaluate the client's work performance to determine if the client is someone they may want to hire. Also, employers may be eligible for Federal Tax Credits by hiring a Goodwill client.

Goodwill has specialized programs that greatly benefit employers and clients. With these programs, an assigned Vocational Rehabilitation Specialist assists throughout the process. Job Coaching is available, as needed, to ensure a smooth transition. Job Retention services are available at no charge for 90 days if a client is hired.

# Programs for Employers

#### COMMUNITY BASED ASSESSMENT

Provides clients an opportunity to sample a particular job of interest. Evaluations assess the client's capabilities, if the goal is realistic, and whether training should continue in the chosen career path. This allows clients to experience several job sites, each lasting only a few days.

#### JOB TRY-OUT

Opportunity for clients to perform a specific job of interest, which may lead to employment. This program ensures the client, Voc Rehab Specialist, referring counselor, and the employer that the client can perform the necessary job tasks.

# Additional Program Offerings

#### CAREER INTEREST ASSESSMENT

Specialized program to assist clients in identifying vocational assets, aptitudes, interests, and potential barriers to employment. This program may include testing, community based assessments, labor market information, and occupational information. This is also available as a 9-hour workshop.

#### JOB COACHING

One-on-one assistance for clients involved in training programs who may need intensive training and/or require a specialized training approach. Coaching can assist in learning job duties, quantity/quality of work standards, work place communication, interpersonal skills, and appropriate work behaviors.

#### JOB DEVELOPMENT

Assists clients in learning the skills necessary to access employment opportunities and obtain employment. This includes instruction and assistance in resume development, job applications, proper work attitude, grooming/hygiene, interpersonal skills, and interviewing skills.

#### JOB RETENTION

Working with clients and employers to problem solve and remove any barriers to job retention. Involves follow-up phone calls and/or visits to the job site as determined by the referring counselor, Specialist, and/or the client. Specialists work closely with the client, employer, and co-workers to support the client in removing barriers to job retention.

#### LIFE SKILLS TRAINING

Teaches behavior skills, interpersonal skills, life management skills, and career skills. Includes training in customer service, building successful relationships, self-confidence, family dynamics, transportation issues, housing, productivity, and emphasizes gaining a sense of control over the client's environment.

#### OCCUPATIONAL SKILL TRAINING

Specialized curriculums for job specific training to employer specifications; including safety practices, workplace literacy, and numeric skills specific to the occupation.

#### WORK ADJUSTMENT

Specialized training in obtaining work behaviors necessary to gain and maintain employment in the community. Program includes proper work habits, social skills, quantity/quality of work, hygiene, acceptance of supervision, and safety awareness.

#### YOUTH WORKS

Provides paid work/training opportunities for out-of-school youth in Licking County, ages 16-21, including youth who have been suspended, expelled, have not graduated, or completed a GED. Clients will attend weekly Life Skills Training and may choose from curriculums in the Occupational Skill Training. Participants must meet designated guidelines for program eligibility. Program hours may vary. This program is partially funded by the Licking County Department of Job and Family Services.



#### GFD/ABLF PROGRAM

On-site program available to anyone who does not have a high school diploma or equivalent level of education.

# Safety and Security

# C.A.R.E. About Safety Program

This program is an exciting one for our Safety and Security Department because it focuses in on our most important asset, our employees. The C.A.R.E. program provides postage paid feedback forms at all Licking/Knox Goodwill worksites that employees can fill out to address safety concerns, to suggest safety ideas, or simply to express a positive or negative safety action they have observed. These forms are submitted to the Safety and Security Coordinator and are reviewed by Goodwill's Safety and Security Committee.

#### C.A.R.F. is:

Committed to safe work practices
Accountable to the safety of ourselves and fellow employees
Responsible to recognize and report unsafe conditions
Encourage compliance to safety rules and regulations

The Safety and Security department of Licking/Knox Goodwill Industries is overseen by the Safety and Security Coordinator. The essential functions of the department is to create, foster, and maintain a culture of safe work conducted in a safe environment. This is accomplished in various ways through awareness training, safety/security surveying, safety audits/inspections, C.A.R.E. about Safety Program all of which assist with integrating a safe and secure mind-set in the workplace.



## Highlights

Final integration of automated barcoded inventory program (Red Beam) in conjunction with the Finance Department resulted in 2008 annual inventory results showing a overall shrinkage reduced to 1.4 percent.

Camera surveillance was expanded to include all Licking/Knox Goodwill owned properties.

C.A.R.E. about Safety program continues to build momentum including our highest participation and most positive feedback to date from our annual workplace hazard assessment employee survey.

Unarmed security guard position was hired to assist in the safety of persons and property and additionally this position has appropriate monitoring equipment at their disposal to allow for remote viewing of all Licking/Knox Goodwill surveillance camera systems.

Safety reached new heights as workplace accident frequency and severity rates were reduced by the highest margin ever. These new achievements resulted in a substantial reduction BWC premiums cost for the year.

Licking/Knox Goodwill continues to be an active participant in the Licking County Safety Council.

# **Automated External Defibrillator Program**

Licking/Knox Goodwill Industries values people first and foremost and is proud to announce it's AED program. AED's save lives and they are now available at Licking/Knox Goodwill owned work sites. In order to facilitate this training, the Safety and Security Coordinator is a certified AED/CPR/FirstAid instructor with the Emergency Care and Safety Institute (a nationally accredited agency) and Goodwill is an official ECSI training Center.
